A word from the President

Sébastien Brochot

Historically, human societies have been built by designating monsters to be slaughtered, responsible for all evils. This first of all, it avoided difficult introspection (which imposes its share of responsibility) and secondly, it offered victims a fake reparation, without really taking into account their suffering or needs.

Societies have evolved. The first step was to stop closing our eyes to the pain. This was called "victim care." Today, professionals from many sectors (Health, Social, Law Enforcement, Justice, etc.) are trained to respond effectively to the distress of victims of sexual violence, both children and adults.

I am convinced that our society is now ripe for the next step1, that of a proactive approach. It is a question of appealing to each other's responsibility, encouraging everyone to be lucid about their own responsibilities, their own weaknesses, their own limitations and to dare to ask for help if they feel the need to do so.

This could only be done by informing and educating widely all populations, all audiences, of all ages and social groups. The prevention kit that we have created raises public awareness of these issues, because the fight to protect children from sexual violence is not only limited to pedophile acts and the viewing of child pornography, but also extends to the insidiously "everyday" situations, often within the family, which cause so much damage and leave so many children with so many aftereffects. This fight is also ours.

Our project was necessary, it met a real need: human, economic and public health. It was possible to make a difference. The difference has been made. Without self-pity, without violence, without any anxious speech.


From 2015 to 2019, the PedoHelp project was expanded, drafting a prevention kit offering concrete, effective, free tools that are now accessible to as many people as possible. It is a positive initiative, to counter an evil rooted in the history of humanity, certainly, but which is not inevitable.

This project ends in 2019, with an extremely positive outcome, its impact being felt to the very end of the world (Central America, Middle East, Asia...). The project site and tools remain available.

If the project ends today, as planned in the schedule, the fight continues. It is by continuing our efforts to make PedoHelp® known that we can hope to one day live in a world where each being carries the courage of benevolence within them. It starts together now.

Composed of representatives of current and potential Parties to the Convention, the Committee assesses the situation of the protection of children from sexual violence at the national level, on the basis of information submitted by national authorities and various sources in response to the General Overview Questionnaire and the Thematic Questionnaire.

Who?

Association Une Vie®

The Association Une Vie® was born from a need for sharing and a desire to promote respect between people. Based on an objective, **the courage of benevolence**, we carry out concrete actions based on three main themes: **child protection**, **citizenship and the duty to remember**.

Apolitical and religious, the Une Vie® Association is a **French nonprofit association of general interest** (law 1901) founded in 2017 by its current president Sébastien Brochot and its treasurer Brigitte Sion, with the purpose of **promoting respect between people and the development of the individual and the collective**.

The association does not pay any salary and only works thanks to the commitment of our volunteers and the help we receive. Our budget report is freely accessible on our website.

The statutes of the association, the internal regulations and the minutes of the meetings of the board of directors are freely available on request.

Situational analysis on sexual violence against children around the world

Recent scientific research and surveys have provided us with a global view of the phenomenon and long-term consequences of sexual violence against children.

We estimate⁵ that **1 in 3 girls** and **1 in 5 boys** will be abused before the age of 18.

We also know that sexual abuse begins before the age of 11 for 1 in 2 victims and before the age of 6 for 1 in 5.

About 90% of child victims of sexual abuse know their abuser, and for every second child victim, it is a family member.

We also know that 1 in 4 assailants is under the age of 18 and that 1 in 5 child sexual abusers is a woman⁶.

Finally, statistics that tell a lot about the after-effects, 1 victim out of 2 who was abused in childhood tried to commit suicide.

The latest surveys estimate that a victim of multiple abuse or repeated abuse during childhood will have a life expectancy reduced by twenty years⁷!

Let us be pragmatic. Beyond the human harm, the financial damage is extremely heavy for society: chronic illnesses, an increase in sick leave, consumption of psychotropic drugs (tobacco, alcohol, etc.).

In France, the cost is estimated at 8 billion euros a year, excluding social costs8.

How to put an end to this scourge?



The PedoHelp® project

We are convinced that only a comprehensive approach to the problem will have a real impact in the short, medium and long term.

It is for this reason that we have designed **an active, global and multi-targeted prevention project**, which is at the same time a primary, secondary and tertiary prevention project.

The PedoHelp® project offers concrete and free solutions to prevent the sexual abuse of children among a wide audience: adults, children and professionals from many sectors of activity.

A multi-target prevention kit

DURABLE - FREE OF CHARGE - INTERNATIONAL - ECOFRIENDLY - INCLUSIVE

Our prevention kit offers various tools, all of which are accessible free of charge on multiple media: websites, books, brochures, posters, videos, podcasts, audio files...

Our kit is available in more than 30 languages thanks to a combination of automatic and professional translations (English, French, Arabic, Spanish...).

Throughout the creation and distribution process, we strive to minimize our carbon footprint. All our supports are designed by our partner this is it[®], signatory of the EcoProd charter.



All **our materials are available in formats adapted to people with disabilities**: our websites meet W3C standards, our brochures are available in ePub format, and our videos are all available in subtitled, audio and transcribed versions.

A response to international commitments

Our project meets several objectives set by international bodies.

The Global Goals for sustainable development

The PedoHelp® project is part of the United Nations campaign *The Global* Goals for sustainable development, which includes point 16.2 of the objectives (peace, justice and strong institutions): "End abuse, exploitation, trafficking and all forms of violence against and torture of children."



International Convention on the Rights of the Child

By distributing contents to this end, the PedoHelp® project also aims to help the 197 signatory states of the International Convention on the Rights of the Child in their commitment to uphold Article 34, as well as the numerous signatory states of the Rio de Janeiro Declaration and Call for Action to Prevent and Stop Sexual Exploitation of Children and Adolescents signed at the 3rd World Congress against the Sexual Exploitation of Children and Adolescents in 2008.



Council of Europe Lanzarote Convention

By creating specific content targeting different audiences, the PedoHelp® project aims to help the 47 States signatory to the Council of Europe's Lanzarote Convention on the Protection of Children against Sexual Exploitation and Sexual Abuse in their commitment to uphold the Convention, in particular Articles 7 and 8.1.



For whom?

A multi-targeted prevention project

Our project aims to raise awareness among many actors with the aim of reducing the number of sexual assaults on children:

- People working with children by raising awareness of the risk of sexual abuse, with a dedicated guide and booklet;
- **Parents** by educating them about behaviors that could weaken their children, with a guide;
- **Children and adolescents** by raising awareness of the risk of sexual abuse and encouraging them to report it, with an <u>awareness website</u>, an illustrated book and an awareness poster;
- Health professionals by encouraging them to take care of pedophile patients, with a
 prevention poster and a guide produced in collaboration with the French Federation
 of Resource Centres for Sexual Violence Workers (FFCRIAVS), partner of the
 PedoHelp® project, working under the aegis of the French Ministry of Health;
- **People who feel attracted to children**, with a <u>prevention website</u> with awareness and information messages.

Why speak directly to people who are attracted to children?

Health professionals agree, and studies confirm that the majority of offenders feel partially overwhelmed by their actions, and do not morally adhere to them. This means that we can avoid the need to act, by offering adapted tools and making them easily accessible. To this end, our <u>pedo.help</u> website has been developed in close cooperation with professionals who work with perpetrators of sexual violence on a daily basis.

Primary, secondary and tertiary prevention

The PedoHelp® project is a primary, secondary and tertiary prevention project:

- It reduces the incidence of pedophilia by targeting parents and children;
- It reduces the prevalence of pedophile acts by targeting people who feel an attraction to children before an offense is committed;
- It induces a limitation of recidivism by offering a tool (the charter of non-fulfillment) to pedophiles and health professionals who work with them.

The charter: a tool to prevent acts of violence and recidivism

Tool: The PedoHelp Commitment to Non-Abuse

Mission: Offer paedophiles and child sexual abusers a contract that can help them to fulfill their commitment to non-abuse or non-recidivism. Professionals can advise their patients to read and sign it online, or they can print it and have it signed during a session. It can also be used as a template to invite a patient to write his or her own non-abuse charter.

This charter is currently used by several health and justice professionals in France.

The online version is an anonymous form. People can simply enter a first name and a country of residence and click on the validation button to sign the commitment.

Report on the results: +450 signatories (online)

A Multilingual Prevention Kit

Our **comprehensive and effective** prevention kit includes **two websites**, **an illustrated** book, three guides, a booklet and two posters.

The French-language kit also contains more than one hundred awareness videos distributed free of charge via various channels (Facebook, YouTube) and a 55-minute documentary (with subtitles in English and automatically translated subtitles in other languages).







How to reach beneficiaries?

Because sexual violence, particularly that affecting children, can only be reduced by sensitizing a large number of people at the same time, the PedoHelp® project aims to sensitize all the actors by relying on existing networks, in order to optimize its visibility.

Internet

We benefit from the support of **Google for nonprofits**, which offers us visibility worldwide via its search engine and about 10.000 clicks per month via its advertising network (about \$9.500 per month).

The network of partners

Currently, our prevention tool is already being used by health professionals to prevent recurrence or to prevent recurrence of a disease before it is acted upon.



In order to reach all our targets, we will rely on associative and institutional networks to distribute our prevention materials. We are in contact with Europol as part of their Internet Safety Project; we are already working with the ECPAT, a child protection association in 88 countries; and our network is constantly expanding, in France, Europe and elsewhere.



An Innovative Approach

Before creating our kit, we obviously looked at similar initiatives in France and elsewhere. We discovered projects like Stop it Now! (United Kingdom, Ireland, Netherlands, USA) or Dunkelfeld (Germany) or DisNo (Switzerland) with whom we are in regular contact. None of these projects was offering what we offered, i. e. a global approach to the problem of sexual violence against children, taking into account all the actors and proposing adapted tools. Our approach is unique in that it addresses the whole problem.

Assessment


An extremely positive result

Our project, which is long-lasting but not evolutionary, has run over 5 years, from 2015 to 2019. The first two years focused on creating the prevention kit.

Our audience on the Internet

The visibility of the PedoHelp® project websites is exceptional! While we thought we would receive a few dozen visits a day, our sites receive hundreds of visits from all over the world.

Looking at some of the keywords typed during the search, it can be concluded that many people came to our site and our videos while searching for child



pornography. We can assume that they were thus stopped in their quest by our contents. If the hypothesis proves to be true, then we play a major preventive role, bypassing the search for illegal or explicit content.

A warm welcome from professionals

The PedoHelp® prevention project is now well known to professionals, whether they are psychiatrists, psychologists, nurses, integration and probation prison counselors, juvenile justice protection educators or childcare professionals. The project materials are used daily, and professionals who monitor perpetrators of sexual violence tell them about the PedoHelp® site.

In conclusion

Recognized and applauded by institutions, professionals in many sectors, and the public, the PedoHelp® project has made a real difference in the prevention of sexual violence against children, by allowing the use of simple and adapted tools to prevent acts of violence, and thus reduce the amount of violence and the number of victims.

LETTER TO HUMANKIND

THE COURAGE OF KINDNESS - BY SÉBASTIEN BROCHOT

My dear children,

I write to you from the bottom of my soul, where it is cold tonight. I wish I had the courage to love better.

Life is a wonderful gift. But it takes so long to find oneself.

We spend so much time untying the knots of our history until we finally learn to love ourselves and others deeply.

I am giving you the following advice so that you can share it with your children, friends and enemies.

Don't miss out on life. It is fleeting.

Never give up. Run away from disillusionment and cynicism.

Be the entrepreneurs of the future; build the world that you dream of.

Some people destroy; you should strengthen and improve what already exists.

Some tremble and hide; you should face your enemies and your fears; take the time to discover and meet people.

Some blindly follow baseless rules, or pray every day at the same time without knowing to whom or why; you should behave with dignity, not out of fear but out of conviction.

Some destroy their bodies or tear up their souls; you should take the time to heal your wounds.

Some take advantage of others, or become richer at their expense, and treat them as objects; you should work towards mutual enrichment based on respect and esteem.

Share your knowledge; listen before you speak. Be courageous enough to keep quiet when you don't know. Do learn.

When you face taunting, ingrained thinking, or pessimism, persevere and pursue your fight.

Be aware that any type of extremism reveals immaturity.

Do not be enslaved to objects or beliefs; don't be imprisoned in a cage made of pixels, fabric or metal. Why lock yourself in when life offers so many opportunities?

Be kind to living beings. All living beings.

Don't look away out of weakness.

Don't display your inner self out of vanity.

Talk together rather than be afraid alone; cowardice kills self-esteem and trust for others.

Be resolutely optimistic by choice and by conviction.

Be kind to yourself and to future generations.

Be aware of the fact that you are the luckiest human beings in the history of humanity; you have inherited the successes and failures of numerous generations. Never have human beings enjoyed so many riches, so much comfort, security, care, leisure, knowledge, and shared humanity.

Talk simply to your children; take the time to explain the world to them, without scaring them. Above all, listen to them. Help them develop their conscience. Make them want to question everything and to look for answers. Teach them to reason and to share their findings.

Explain to them that everything has a cause and that everything has an effect, but don't overwhelm them. Give them the possibility to make choices and to change their minds many times, without shame.

Finally, teach them to keep faith in humanity.

Then your children will do better than we did. They will fix what my parents have destroyed. They will heal the wounds that I caused, and they will teach you, their parents, to become better human beings.

Life is a rite of passage towards maturity, towards the freedom to be oneself. But it only lasts for a short while. Accept this fact with humility.

At the end of your life, do not ask if you've succeeded - who would come out victorious of such a fight? - but ask yourself if you've tried hard enough.

Do not forget to leave some of your dreams incomplete, for future generations.

My dear children, have the courage to love.

Have the courage of kindness.
